#### **Family Advocacy Mission**

The mission of the Air Force Family Advocacy Program is to build healthy communities through implementing programs and policies designed for the prevention and treatment of domestic abuse, child abuse and neglect, and Problematic Sexual Behavior in Children

#### **Family Advocacy Definitions**

#### **Domestic/Partner Violence**

An offense under the UCMJ, United States Code, or state law involving the use, or threatened use of force or violence against someone who is:

- 1. A current or former spouse/partner, or
- 2. A person with whom the abuser shares a child in common, or
- 3. A current or former intimate partner

#### **Child Abuse**

Acts or omissions toward an unmarried person under the age of 18 years bringing physical, sexual, psychological, or emotional harm, injury, or mistreatment, including neglect. These acts/omissions are committed by a parent, guardian, or legal caretaker.

# **Intervention**

It is Air Force Policy to identify report, assess, treat and provide services to victims of domestic violence and their families. Treatment is provided for partner or child abuse, and neglect incidents.

Our Treatment Managers work with the family members on an individual, couple, family and/or group basis.

This provides clients with the counseling, support, information and resources necessary to help cope with incidents of domestic violence, and helps to prevent a future reoccurrence.

#### Domestic Abuse Victim Advocate (DAVA)

Provides information and referrals for military and civilian resources such as hotlines, shelters, legal aid, treatment resources, chaplain resources, military transitional compensation, attorney general's victim services for victims, and victim/witness liaison programs.

If requested, accompanies the victim to court proceedings, aids in filing Protection from Abuse (PFA) orders and requests Military Protection Orders of command. Works as a liaison with unit Commanders and First Sergeants.

## **Prevention Services**

#### **New Parent Support Program**



- For families expecting a baby or who have children between the ages of 0-3 years.
- Home visits for parent education by a Registered Nurse and/or Social Worker
- Help young families provide a safe and nurturing environment for their children
- Individual/marital counseling

#### **Educational Programs**

• Voluntary education classes for all such as parenting, couples communication, anger management, relationship choices and more!
