Dover AFB Library: Transition to Virtual



Due to budgetary constraints and locally redundant resources, the Dover AFB Library will be transitioning to a virtual system (leveraging the AF investment in Zinio and Overdrive), while pushing the most popular collections (children’s books and education material) to locations where they can continue to be utilized.

The Education Center will house a computer lab/sitting area where members will be able to sign out CLEP, DANTES, and study materials. Additionally, the Youth Center and Child Development Center will be supplied with age appropriate children’s books. Other programs, such as the summer reading program, will continue as planned. For those looking for a “brick and mortar” option, the city of Dover has two public libraries, one of which is the newly-opened library in downtown Dover, with both offering state of the art services. Ultimately, this transition will allow Dover AFB’s limited fiscal resources to be more efficiently allocated, while still meeting the needs of our Airmen and their families.

The new Dover AFB Library Transformation Configuration will officially open in the Youth Center and the Education Bldg. on 21 Mar 14. The Youth Center will provide library services during its normal operating hours and the Education Office Library will be open from 0800-1630, Monday-Friday.
